
### Ministry


### Ministry

What a great question! Every Wednesday night there is so much "life" buzzing around campus! Nearly fifty kids, more than sixty youth, four adult small groups, Prayer Meeting, Choir and accompanists are all meeting. During any given Wednesday, there are four generations gathering to serve, grow, and fellowship! One primary piece of these meaningful assemblies is a program we've titled, "Family XP."

**The Why:** As a staff, we desired to be more intentional about engaging entire families at one time and in one place. We discovered our small group gatherings, while purposefully helping family individuals to grow, separated the family unit. So, this idea of bringing together whole family units grew into Family XP.

**The What:** Family XP stands for 'Family Experience.' It is a time for families to gather and experience fellowship with other families and to experience fellowship with God. It all takes place in the fellowship hall from 5-6 pm.

**The Schedule:** Families enter and grab a simple "to-go style" dinner prepared by our Wednesday Night Kitchen Team. Then, at 5:40 we have welcome and announcements. At 5:45 we have a fun time of prizes, recognition, silly games or other fun activity. At 5:50 a short devotion style message is offered. Finally, just before 6, we dismiss with prayer and move on to the night's activities.

**The Discovery:** One immediate discovery upon beginning this program was the engagement of family members who did not regularly attend any small group gathering. We have been able to draw in and form relationships with moms and dads who would simply drop off their kids for Wednesday activities and pick them up at the end of the night. We love that parents entrust the care of their kids to us, but we also wanted to minister to these parents as well. God blessed us with this opportunity, and we hope you can come and "experience" this gathering for yourself!
